

## **Burying Ashes**

Our peaceful Garden of Remembrance at the side of St James's Church is available for the interment of ashes. Each interment takes place individually with the ashes dispersed into the ground into unmarked plots.

To maintain its tranquility, it is intended that the garden should be as natural and unencumbered as possible, however bulbs are allowed to be buried to mark the site of the ashes.

Alternatively, if your family has an existing grave in St James's Church-yard, it may be possible to arrange for the ashes of your loved one to be buried there. The Parish Office can further advise on this.

### Memorial Wall

Alongside the Garden of Remembrance, our Memorial Wall allows a permanent way of marking the burial of ashes of a loved one. Anyone whose ashes are buried either in the churchyard or Garden of Remembrance can have their name engraved on the Memorial Wall.

## Service of Commemoration

On the first Sunday of November, we hold a service of commemoration where those whose funerals have taken place in the previous twelve months are remembered by name. You will receive details from us about this service and we hope you will want to attend.

## Wake or reception

The hall in Church House may be available to use for a wake or reception after a funeral or burial of ashes—giving you an opportunity to remember your loved one in a less formal setting. Contact the Parish Office for more information.

Father, we commend to your faithful love those who are crying from the depths; help them to watch and pray through their time of darkness, in sure and certain hope of the dawn of your forgiveness and redemption; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.
